He practiced his profession in Cleveland, OH from 1973 to 1995 initially in private practice and then at the Cleveland Clinic, where he was the division chief of hand surgery. He was a world-renowned surgeon with an unparalleled experience in the treatment of hand tumors and complex hand surgery. He was also recognized as a patient teacher of several generations of plastic surgery residents. He retired in 2014. Early was a devoted father husband and grandfather who enjoyed his life-long passion of fly fishing – one sparked by a course given to him by Kathy. He spent a lifetime designing and tying his own flies building bamboo fly rods, traveling around the country and the world on fishing expeditions, painting his catches in vibrant water-colors, and writing articles about the subject for fishing magazines. He was a naturalist who loved spending time outdoors. He was an observant Jew who delighted in learning about Jewish history and the Kabbalah.
