Later that year, he became president of the business, which he would lead until its sale in 1992. He stayed on as a consultant until his retirement in 2008. In his 60 years in the business, he was known as a staunch advocate of equal opportunity housing. One of his proudest accomplishments as a Realtor was his role in helping to create a relationship between the Pennsylvania real estate industry and the Philadelphia and Pennsylvania Human Relations Commissions. In addition to his term as the president of the Greater Philadelphia Association of Realtors in 1969, he also served on the executive board of the Pennsylvania Association of Realtors. He is remembered as a patron the arts with a special fondness for musical theater. Mr. Cobrin is survived by his son Jeffrey and his partner of 32 years, Sandra "Sandy" Gittis, as well as her three daughters, three son-in-laws and seven grandchildren.
