Florence Herman (nee Sokolof), age 83, died of natural causes June 7, 2016 on her 63rd wedding anniversary. She was born in South Philadelphia of immigrant parents. She enjoyed retelling the story of her parents' courageous escape from the pogroms in the Ukraine, who walked from Odessa to Cherbourg, France, hiding in fields and caves with 2 small children; receiving passage money in steerage from the Rothschilds for the trip to Boston on the ship Liberty. She was a knowledgeable, articulate Jewish historian and delighted in speaking Yiddish with her friends and family. She was a proud graduate of South Philadelphia High School for Girls. There, she heard Dr. Bertram Korn, Senior Rabbi at Congregation Keneseth Israel, deliver the graduation speech. She was so impressed that she pledged she would someday join his synagogue which she did, along with her husband, Carl, in 1968. She became the first docent to interpret the stained glass windows and other religious artifacts around the Elkins Park building to both Jewish and Gentile groups. She was a co-president of Sisterhood and active in the Music Arts Committee. Florence was the first adult Bat Mitzvah at Keneseth Israel and a member of the first Chavura confirmation group. She instilled her love of Judaism and higher learning in her children. Next to her family, Judaism and her family roots, she enjoyed being an accomplished hand knitter, creating over 600 artisan quality sweaters which are still sought after and admired to this day. She was one of the first survivors of ovarian cancer in the US. She was considered a Woman of Valor by those who knew and loved her. She is succeeded by her beloved husband, Carl, her children Sheri Herman-Karr and Lisa Abramowitz, and her grandchildren Adam, Bret, Matthew and Callie. After a lifetime battle with many illnesses, she finally succumbed to a hemorrhagic stroke and complications due to Stage 4 lung cancer on July 2, 2016 at Temple University Hospital in the presence of her daughter, Carol; son, George and one grandson, Demian. She was an exemplary mother, grandmother to Demian, Damon, Katie and Noelle and great-grandmother to Cosmo, Ilias, Robert, John Nicolas, Garret and Harper Lily. Her love for her son-in-law, J. David Bethel was known to all who would listen. She married George C. Albright in 1970 and the two were devoted best friends for the rest of their lives. She was a humanitarian and champion of many causes. As the owner of Bobbi's Wig Designs in Northeast Phila. for more than 45 years, she provided services to hundreds of cancer patients of all ages, men and women, including two year olds, often free of charge. As a survivor of multiple bouts of cancer she felt that people deserved the dignity of maintaining their appearance while battling the effects of chemotherapy. Her customers were often directly referred by St. Christopher's Hospital for Children and other treatment facilities from as far away as Arizona. When her illness required the closing of her business, she turned her attention to Kleinlife JCC in the Greater Northeast, where she served on the Board of Directors and facilitated Active Adult Life classes in Positive Thinking and Lifelong Learning. Her concern for the safety of the handicapped and elderly led to her taking a position on the Philadelphia 7th Police District Advisory Council, where she lobbied for more protective crosswalk safety. She contributed generously for many years to SmileTrain.org, Greenpeace and FeedtheChildren.org. She was a life-long supporter of our armed forces and routinely donated to multiple charities benefiting veterans. Despite her illnesses, she served her family and community until her very last day on earth. From the Book of Ben Sira - A Hellenistic Jewish scribe "Fear not death, as we are destined to die. We share it with all who ever lived, with all who ever will be. Bewail the dead, hide not your grief, do not restrain your mourning. But remember that continuing sorrow is worse than death. When the dead are at rest, let their memory rest, and be consoled when the soul departs. Death is better than a life of pain, and eternal rest than constant sickness. Seek not to understand what is too difficult for you, search not for what is hidden from you. Be not over-occupied with what is beyond you, for you have been given more than you can understand.
