Esther accompanied Robert while he completed a stint in the U.S. Air Force, before they settled in Rochester New York. In 1968, as one of only six participants, Esther completed a brand-new pilot program to become a nurse practitioner. She went on to specialize in pediatric medicine, starting in Rochester, where she partnered with Dr. Cenie Cafarelli. Esther liked to say that she had five hundred children under the age of twelve — her beloved patients. In 1975, the family moved to the Philadelphia area, where Esther helped found and then led a well-baby clinic under the auspices of the Visiting Nurses Association in Lansdale, PA. In this role, she served hundreds of low-income mothers and their children — and in some cases their grandchildren - over the next two decades. Throughout her life, Esth-er contributed to the fight for social and racial justice and advocated for children, with whom she always fostered a special connection. A life-long learner, she pursued a range of interests and devoted time and energy to developing her many creative talents and ex-ploring her love of nature. Most of all however, Esther's signature gift to all who crossed her path manifested through her generous and caring nature, her kindness, and her focused desire and ability to nurture others. She exercised an impressive level of agency throughout her life — drawing on her fiercely independent spirit to chart her own course, guided always by a set of deeply held values and a strong moral compass. Esther is survived by three children of her own — Mi-chael, Ruth (Ron-deceased), and Susan (Pierre) — along with her adopted-by-prac-tice daughter Nancy and four grandchildren


