

a new chapter of American Jewish history.



Jewish Federation to Gauge Community in New Study

R or the first time in a decade, the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia will research and release a population study of the Philadelphia-area Jewish community. The study will be published in the fall of 2019.

The population study usually takes place every 10 years by largecity Jewish federations to measure the current state of their Jewish communities, but it is unlike a census, said Kelly Romirowsky, director of grants and evaluation.

"People think of it that way, but it's not," she said. "It's actually a sample survey." Whereas a cen-


sus counts each individual in an entire population, "this is looking for a representative sample to get an estimate of the total population and ask

questions of them." The last study was conducted

in 2008 and results were released in 2009, analyzing demographic and socioeconomic information. Findings for the new study will include the geographic distribution of the community, Jewish affiliation and involvement, views on Israel, civic engagement and Jewish education, including day schools and supplementary schools.

Romirowsky said the study will look at five counties — Philadelphia, Bucks, Chester, Delaware and Montgomery — and

the Jewish communities within them, including those who identify as Jewish in some way or live in a Jewish household.

The study will also gather participants' thoughts on "believing, belonging, behaving types of things," such as attitudes toward philanthropic giving, social service needs and Jewish identity.

The study is funded by the Jewish Federation through its Jewish Community Fund, an endowment fund, private foundations and individual donors. It will be conducted by the research firm Westat.

Typically, studies have been conducted over the phone. But for 2018, the Jewish Federation offered online surveys. The firm first mailed out notifications to participants - about 1,300 to 1,500 people determined through probability sampling - with instructions to follow a link to complete the questionnaire online. (A hard copy is available, if preferred.)

Romirowsky hopes they'll receive a better response rate with the online format, as well as a more random sample.

She added this will be beneficial for the Jewish Federation, too: They'll be able to see where the needs are in the community in order to make data-informed funding decisions for stakeholders.

Brandeis University's Steinhardt Social Research Institute has produced many community studies for large cities with Jewish populations over the years, including Jewish federations in Boston; Naples, Fla.; Nashville and Middle Tennessee; Seattle; Buffalo, N.Y.; Western North Carolina; and Greater Rhode Island.

The most recent population studies for Pittsburgh and Washington, D.C., came out in February.

Greater Pittsburgh's Jewish community has grown 17 percent since its last community study in 2002 - it now has 50,000 Jewish adults and children, constituting just over 2 percent of the area population. The community is more spread out, too, consisting of highly educated and mostly middle-class people.

The study will look at five counties — Philadelphia, Bucks, Chester, Delaware and Montgomery.

Almost 300,000 Jews live in the Greater Washington, D.C., area — the third-largest Jewish community in the country. Jews living in the metro D.C. area are younger than the national Jewish population; the median age of D.C.-area Jewish adults is 45, younger than the national median age of 50. The community is also diverse: Seven percent identify as LGBTQ, and another 7 percent identify as a person of color or Hispanic/Latino.

Adam and Sara Laver are co-chairing the committee overseeing Philadelphia's population study.

"We're very excited about having a terrific outside firm that isn't necessarily one of the usual firms that handle these types of studies," Adam Laver noted. "It's very important to Sara and me and to the leadership at [Jewish] Federation that this be meaningful, and we're aware of past shortcomings in population studies that we in the Greater Philadelphia Jewish community have commissioned."

They're also aware of the studies commissioned by other Jewish federations, which he said call into question "how helpful they might be, and if they really are representative of Jewish populations in those areas."

Other committees include a lay leadership and a technical advisory committee, which includes people like Sergio Della Pergola, world-renowned demographer of Hebrew University of Jerusalem; Larry Eichel, director of Pew Charitable Trusts' Philadelphia research initiative; Kevin Gillen, senior research fellow of the Lindy Institute for Urban Innovation at Drexel University; and a host of others, all lending their efforts to the Jewish Federation.


Laver said they will help "refine and hone down and, to the best of our ability, make this meaningful so that we can further the work of our Jewish Federation."

Even if the findings came back with some unfavorable data, he said it's still significant to discover where the needs of the community lie, like with the Holocaust survivor community.

"Are we meeting their needs here in the Philadelphia region?" he asked. "Can we even know

how many people there are? These are one of the things we need to look into.

"We don't want to overlook anyone."

A lot has changed in the decade since the last study: The whole idea of Jewish identity is not the same as it used to be, Laver said.

"You may have someone who affiliates through Chabad and also through a local synagogue, or goes into the Old City Jewish Arts Center, or is just as connected through PJ Library. These artificial boundaries that gave comfort in the past, it's much more difficult to find who is a Jew and how one expresses their Jewish identity. That's what we'll be seeing more of now." \bullet

New PA Budget Benefits Jewish Day Schools

revenue source for the school's scholarships — are "life-changing," Kohelet Yeshiva Executive Director Stuart Gasner said.

"I don't even know what they would do" without the aid, he said. "Their children wouldn't even be able to attend this institution. Families recognize that, without this generous program and without the school being able to offer scholarships through the generosity of our community, there's no way that a lot of our families would even consider our school."

Forty percent of Pennsylvania Jewish day school students qualify and receive scholarships through the EITC or the Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) programs.

These programs incentivize businesses to donate to approved school scholarship funds, such as the Foundation for Jewish Day Schools at the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia, to receive a tax credit. Families can then apply and, based on eligibility and the scholarship

monies' availability, receive scholarships to attend nonpublic schools.

The 2018-2019 Pennsylvania budget increases the EITC program by \$25 million, for a total of \$160 million and continues funding the OSTC program at \$50 million.

"We see numbers go down and we see numbers go up, and we see regulatory changes that hurt low- and middle-income families, and then some years it is helpful," said Arielle Frankston-Morris, director of Teach PA, a part of the Orthodox Union's Teach Advocacy Network. "Thankfully, this was a year that really helped Jewish education."



The budget also includes new regulatory changes to these programs. The maximum annual household income to receive scholarships has increased from \$75,000 to \$85,000.

"These programs offer educational access for low- and middle-income families," Frankston-Morris said. "It's really leveling the playing field for students from different communities and different socioeconomic backgrounds and giving kids an opportunity to be at a school that is best suited for them."

The new budget also makes school safety a priority, she said. The Office of Safe Schools will offer a \$6 million grant program for school police officers, of which \$2.6 million will be prioritized for nonpublic schools.

"We fought tooth-and-nail for inclusion of nonpublic schools in security increases this year, and we are very happy that there's an increase in that program," Frankston-Morris said. "Lots of our schools will be applying for a grant this year."

The budget continues to include about \$88 million for services to nonpublic schools and about \$27 million for textbooks, materials and equipment for such institutions.

Getting these budget changes has not been an easy battle. Frankston-Morris said Teach PA met with legislators, had legislators come visit schools and sent a delegation of 200 parents, students, educators and community leaders to Harrisburg on May 2 to rally for the tax credit programs, as well as for additional security and health funding.

"We're thrilled at the state and very thankful to the state, to the governor and the legislature for implementing this change, for improving the increase," said Ellen Horowitz Matz, director of the Education Tax Credit programs at the Foundation for Jewish Day Schools. "It's very expensive sending kids to private schools. It's extremely helpful, and the price of a private education, from both the parents and, in certain instances, the schools when they decide to provide that private education, it gets more and more challenging every year."

For the 2017-2018 school year, the Foundation for Jewish Day Schools awarded more than \$6.5 million in needs-based scholarships to more than 790 students to attend local Jewish day schools. The foundation also awarded more than \$780,000 in scholarships to almost 250 preschool students.

At the moment, the foundation does not know how many more students it will be able to award because of the tax credit program increases.

For the coming school year, the foundation is considering applications of families who have already applied. The foundation will work with families who decide now to enroll their child in a Jewish day school on a case-by-case basis.

"It's sort of done on an individual basis, if there are funds available and if the school feels the family would be eligible," Horowitz Matz said. "If a family is thinking about attending one of our Jewish day schools or preschools, they should talk to the financial officer at their school. Don't do it one way or the other ever. Always talk to the school directly.

"We want families to know that if they're interested in sending their child to Jewish day schools, we want to help them. They should always place a phone call."

Horowitz Matz noted that the foundation does not meet the entire need for Jewish day school scholarships in the community. The foundation does not have enough money to completely fund families who are eligible, and some families who are not eligible may still need scholarships.

"The cost of a private education is a chunk for families to bite off," she said. "It's hard, any private school."

After eligibility is determined, the foundation works closely with schools, such as Kohelet Yeshiva, which make recommendations as to the actual awards.

Gasner said that Jewish day schools, families and donors are thankful the tax credit programs exist.

"The recipients are incredibly appreciative to the schools and to the donors that they know that their children are able to receive a high-caliber Jewish education, a modern Orthodox Jewish education for their families," Gasner said. "I've heard the word 'life-changing' many times. It puts children on a path to set them up for success, to open up doors for the future." •

Israel, Philly Connect with Sister Cities

n the front page of the Oct. 28, 1966 issue of the *Jewish Exponent*, a photo of David Ben-Gurion declaring Israel's independence in Tel Aviv sits next to a painting of Congress declaring independence in Philadelphia.

The photos accompany an article about a change in Philadelphia's relationship with Tel Aviv that has remained strong to this day. The day before the issue ran, the Philadelphia City Council unanimously passed a resolution authorizing the establishment of a sister relationship between the two cities, the second such relationship Philadelphia established — the first being with Florence, Italy in 1964.

"Tel Aviv is many things to many people" the article said. "It is a city of wide boulevards — Rothschild, Allenby and others. It is also a city of narrow streets clogged with hornblowing, stationary automobiles. It is a city of beautiful buildings; it is a city of ramshackle houses, decaying before they reach a score of years. ... But Tel Aviv has another distinction; it will soon be Philadelphia's sister city."

Over the next several decades, Philadelphia established sister city relationships with eight other cities around the world, but the relationship with Tel Aviv stands out as one of the most active,

said Siobhan Lyons, president and CEO of Citizen Diplomacy International Philadelphia, which oversees Philadelphia's sister city relationships. In 1997, the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia made Netivot and the surrounding district of Sdot Negev a sister city of Philadelphia as well.

"[Tel Aviv is] one of our more active sister city relationships," Lyons said. "That helps because there is such a strong Jewish community here, and also because there is an Israeli Chamber of Commerce and, until very recently, the Israeli consulate had an office here in Philadelphia. And until recently, of course, we had a direct flight from Philadelphia to Tel Aviv. That certainly helps the relationship continue because sister city relationships are not only at an official level. They are people-to-people exchanges."

The 1966 resolution noted several similarities between the City of Brotherly Love and what is today Israel's cultural and economic center. Besides the fact that they are the birthplaces of independence in their respective nations, they both have similar industries, are centers of art and culture and, of course, share an affinity to the contributions of Philadelphia's Jewish community.

Today, Lyons said, the two cities continue to have commonalities and provide opportunities for each other. Philadelphia, for example, can glean a great deal from the innovation and high-tech industry of Tel Aviv. They are both open-minded cities as well, evident in Tel Aviv's reputation as an LGBT-friendly city.

The strength of this relationship can be seen through the delegations that shuttle between them. Over the past few years, for example, delegations from Tel Aviv have come to Philadelphia to learn more about Independence Hall and about how to increase tourism to historical sites, Lyons said.

Programming over the past five decades has changed, though the goals of learning from the other and strengthening the relationship have stayed the same. That programming has included exchanges of best practices and two missions led by former Mayor Michael Nutter to promote trade



between the cities. There are also plans to launch a new high school exchange program with a school in Tel Aviv.

"We are home to one of the oldest Jewish congregations in the United States," Lyons said. "We have a very strong Jewish community. Those are the large reasons for why the relationship was created."

About an hour's drive south of Tel Aviv, and just 10 miles away from Gaza, sits another of Philadelphia's sister cities — Netivot and Sdot Negev, an area of about 40,000 people.

About 20 years ago, the Jewish Federation decided to participate in the Jewish Agency for Israel's Partnership2Gether program, which connects Jewish communities around the world to communities on Israel's periphery.

"We had a group of Philadelphians who went to Israel and visited a few places, and they really made a connection with the people in Netivot and Sdot Negev," said Beth Razin, senior manager of community engagement at the Jewish Federation. "We've had a really successful 20-plus years working together."

Over those two decades, the Jewish Federation has supported education, cultural entrepreneurship and creative and healthy placemaking in Netivot and Sdot Negev. This has included programs to emphasize STEAM education, enhance small business skills and raise the quality of life. The partnership has resulted in the construction of the Kaiserman Family Spiritual Center, the Tanenbaum Music Conservatory and the Robert Saligman Early Childhood Development Center.

Because of the proximity to Gaza, security also has been a focus. The Jewish Federation has helped refurbish bomb shelters, provide needed supplies and establish a program to train teenagers to help out in times of crisis.

The Jewish Federation sends regular missions to the area, where participants get an appreciation for the region's unique security needs, as well as the opportunity to bond with locals. Residents of Netivot and Sdot Negev also visit Philadelphia. In 2013, for instance, the Tavlinim group, a catering company supported by Partnership2Gether, visited Philadelphia to put on culinary demonstrations.

"We've really created programming that has been copied by other federations in their communities, which is a real compliment to what we've been able to do," said David Gold, Philadelphia co-chair of the Partnership2Gether committee.

"The partnership model really grew out of the idea that we should work together to see what we can do together," Razin said. "The Israeli community are partners. They want to do more projects on our side, to do more about education and Jewish identity building. They see themselves as being able to offer those kinds of projects."

Right now, for example, there is an art installation called "Art from the Negev" making its way through the Philadelphia area. Its two artists, Simcha Even-Haim and Yafa Dadon, hail from Sdot Negev and Netivot, respectively.

"We can share and learn from each other and help each other as communities," Razin said. "[It's] what's behind the idea of partnership." •



The Fast and the Furious: Yom Kippur and Avoiding Being 'Hangry' Marissa Stern | JE Staff

h, the sounds of Yom Kippur. The silence of deep prayer and meditation during services. The shuffle of feet as people sit and stand intermittently as they reflect and atone for the past year.

And the rumbling of empty stomachs as people head into the core hours of fasting for the holiday.

Fasting for Yom Kippur is meaningful, but it is certainly not easy. If you ever woke up the next morning and instinctively poured yourself a bowl of cereal without a second thought, don't worry — you're not alone.

But there are ways to prepare for the fast that will keep you energized and healthy for the seemingly never-ending 25 hours.

Though Yom Kippur is still a week away, it's not too early to begin



preparing your body for the fast.

One important tip from Alex Pollak, founder and CEO of ParaDocs Worldwide Inc., an events medical services company: If you need it, ask for help.

"People have underlying conditions that are sometimes exacerbated by fasting," he noted. "Ask your rabbi for a *heter* to eat if you need medication or have issues."

Don't be afraid to sit, even if everyone else is standing, he added.

"If you feel weak, sit," he said, "especially if you're sitting for a while then suddenly stand, your blood pressure could drop and you could pass out. If you feel weak and lightheaded, you could lay down and put your feet up because it redistributes the blood."



Start skipping those morning coffee runs no matter how much that may pain you — and begin cutting down on caffeine at least a week before, advised Dr. Tzvi Dwolatzky in an article on **myjewishlearning.com**. This will help the headache you may get when you suddenly withdraw from caffeine.

Also start to take it easy with salty foods and artificial sweeteners and keep away from alcohol because it stimulates the loss of body water, he noted.

Leading up to the fast, drink liquids but don't overdo it. Make like a camel in the desert and drink plenty of water, but you don't have to feel like a water balloon — drinking too much can wash out essential salts from your body, the article said.

Pollak also noted you need electrolytes to really hydrate you before the fast, and also rehydrate you afterward.

Known as the Philly Dietitian, Theresa Shank, a registered dietitian and owner of Philly Dietitian LLC, echoed the importance of drinking plenty of water.

"Drink a lot of water the day before to ensure adequate hydration for the next day's fast," she advised.

For good measure, she recommends drinking half your body weight in fluid ounces.

"For example, if a person weighs 160 pounds, then their recommended water intake would be 80 fluid ounces," she said. "I recommend that this liquid apply to water instead of caffeinated liquids, which tend to naturally dehydrate the body."

Though Shank is not Jewish, she has a few recommendations for pre-Yom Kippur meals. And she recommends not skipping meals the day before.

"A person will want to consume nutrient-dense meals and snacks that include protein, fiber and carbohydrates to help keep them full, but most importantly to provide longer lasting energy that their body will need to use as fuel during the fast," she noted.

The day before the fast, you might also want to skip the gym.

"It is recommended not to exercise the day before because it can decrease a person's energy stores — which the body will need to use as fuel for the fast — and also increase a person's chance for dehydration during Yom Kippur," she explained.

Avoid drinks like juice, alcohol or those with

caffeine because it can induce dehydration. She also advised limiting or avoiding the consumption of high-sodium foods such as canned goods or packaged items that may lead to an increased sensation of thirst.

Instead, Shank has a few recommendations of what to eat the day before: whole-wheat pasta, brown rice, quinoa, legumes and lean protein sources such as chicken and fish.

The day before, eat fruits and vegetables that have higher water content, such as peaches, watermelon, cucumbers, cauliflower, peppers, spinach, carrots and peas.

However, she noted, not everyone should fast. As any list of what to do to prepare for Yom Kippur will tell you, check with your physician to make sure that you are able to fast. If you take medications, be careful that you don't need to take it on a full stomach.

"Many chronic medical conditions, such as high blood pressure, heart disease or arthritis, do not usually prevent you from fasting, as long as your condition is stable," Dwolatzky noted. "This is usually the case for pregnant and nursing mothers as well. Clearly an acute illness accompanied by fever, vomiting or diarrhea will prevent you from fasting. Before going any further, you should check with your doctor whether your health allows you to fast." Shank does not recommend that children under 12 fast for the holiday. And seniors may have difficulties as well.

"Fasting can be difficult, especially for seniors who have medical conditions such as diabetes or hypertension, two conditions that are affected by a person's nutritional intake," she said. "I recommend that individuals with these conditions or other medical necessities speak with their physician before participating in the fast."

To prepare, Shank created a sample day of a protein-, fiber- and carbohydrate-rich diet to consume before Yom Kippur:

Breakfast: eggs, whole grain toast with peanut butter and a serving of fruit, or a bagel with lox and fruit

Snack: Grapes and cheese

Lunch: Chicken, vegetables and quinoa or brown rice Snack: Hummus with baby carrots, whole-grain pita chips and a serving of fruit

Dinner: Whole-grain pasta or potatoes served with fish and a starchy vegetable such as carrots, peas or corn

JEWISH GENETIC DISEASES

Jewish genetic diseases are a group of diseases for which screening is recommended in the Ashkenazi population. One in five Ashkenazi Jews is a carrier for at least one of the current 19 preventable and life-threatening diseases. Tay-Sachs is an inherited genetic disorder — invariably fatal that mainly affects Jewish infants. It is inherited from two healthy parents who both carry the gene, and there is a one-in-four chance that a baby will develop the disease if both parents are carriers. A simple blood test can determine whether an individual carries the Tay-Sachs gene. All Jewish people considering having children should arrange for Tay-Sachs testing. Late onset Tay-Sachs disease is a degenerative genetic disorder that causes debilitating physical and/or mental symptoms.
